The Merry Ovnick Fellowship is established by <u>the Society of Architectural Historians/Southern</u> <u>California Chapter (SAH/SCC)</u> honor of pasPresident and longtime board member Merry Ovnick. It provides for \$1,000 annually to support the travel of an advanced graduate student to the SAH Annual International Conference. The Fellowship will be awarded annually, with its first recipient in early 2025.

In celebration of the Fellowship, The Merry Ovnick Fellowship Fundraiser and Lecture will be held on Saturday, January<sup>th</sup>252025 at the historic Neutra Office in Silver Lake and broadcast via Zoom Daniel Paul, architectural historian, will be the featured speaker.
